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## Dear Parents/Carers

We have come to the end of another busy term today. Lots of fun and learning has happened. I would like to take this opportunity to thank you for your continuing support and feedback which is greatly received.

### **Opal Play**

We have officially begun our Opal Play journey. We have a team of people who are known as The Opal working party and it is their role to take the lead on developing this programme.

I have attached the welcome letter which Opal Play provide for us to share with you with further details on and the power of play information booklet.

We have conducted some surveys to find out the views of parents, staff and children. The summary of the findings are below:

#### **Parent Survey Highlights:**

- All parents agreed that playtime is important, with over 90% rating play as "brilliant" or "good."
- Many parents reported their children are happy with the new play opportunities and feel it has helped build friendships.
- Parent's state that play is now more structured than before.
- There is strong interest in the addition of a music and dance area, followed by more sports equipment and loose parts for creative play.
- Over 95% of parents are happy with their children getting minor muddy clothes, with one parent commenting, "A tired and muddy child is a happy child."
- All parents who completed the survey expressed willingness to support the school in our OPAL journey, including fundraising and donating unused items.

### **Staff Survey Highlights:**

- All staff believe playtime is important, and most feel that play has improved since introducing new opportunities.
- Staff have seen an immediate improvement in behaviour, with fewer incidents and medical issues at playtime.
- While levels of happiness in the children at playtimes are reported as average, many staff noted improvements since starting OPAL play.
- Football has been a frequent source of disagreements, but the introduction of referees has begun to reduce issues.
- Staff fondly recalled childhood play involving dens, skipping and imaginative games, with many feeling that children today have fewer such opportunities.
- Top suggestions for future improvements include social areas, a music and dance space, and more opportunities for building and climbing.
- All staff are eager to support through fundraising and resource collection.

### **Children's Survey Highlights:**

- Most children feel that adults are consistent in their play expectations, but almost all say they cannot access
  grassed or bush areas daily.
- Many would love to use the field all year round but are often limited by weather.
- Children want more resources to build, role-play and engage in a wider range of activities like go-karting.
- Almost 90% of children said they enjoy playtimes.
- Preferred activities currently include running, climbing, football and dancing.
- Their top "dream" additions to the playground in the future include a sandpit, go-kart or bike track, slide, climbing wall and a self-build obstacle course.

We are excited by the enthusiasm from our whole school community and will be using this feedback to shape the next phase of our OPAL journey. Thank you for your continued support in making play a rich, inclusive and joyful part of your child's school life at Brigg Primary School.
